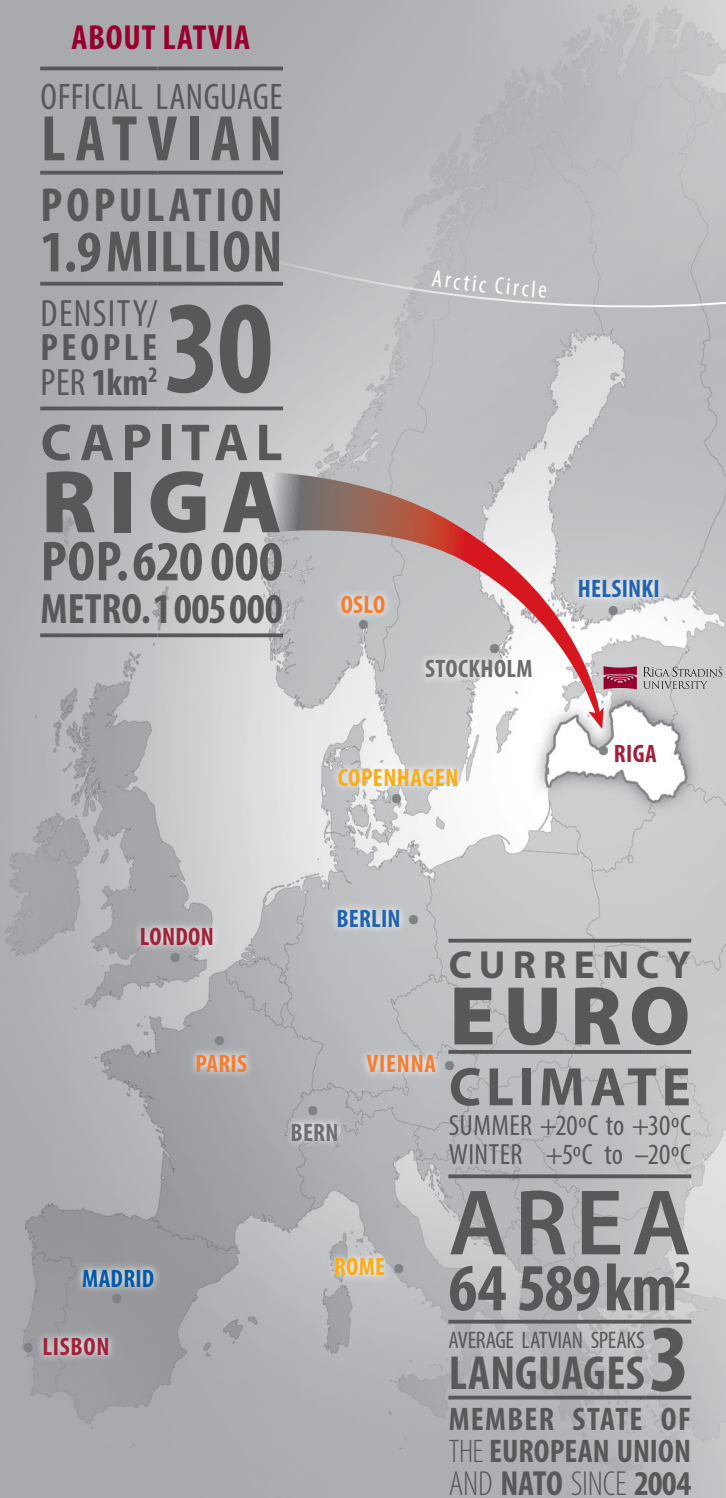

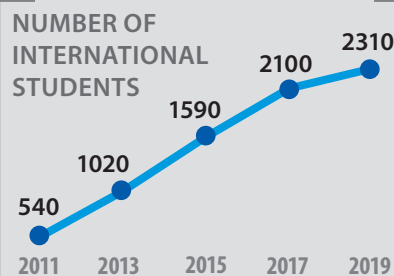

- Bachelor's degree in Health Sciences or Social Sciences
 - Diploma
 - Diploma supplement/transcript of grades
- CV
- Written academic essay about a topic on rehabilitation (1000 words)
- Document confirming **English** proficiency* (preferable)
- Copies of publications in peer-reviewed journals (preferable)
- Documents of additional training and activities (preferable)

* International test score (e.g. IELTS, TOEFL, etc.)

The study process encourages students to think outside the box, and the lecture topics are relevant to both - clinical practice with patients and work in a healthcare organisation.
